# Reasons for Aggression

	(SA & A) %
If I don't, the student wont learn to behave appropriately	20
It makes me feel better	20
The student deserves it for behaving so badly	24
I don't know what else to do with the student	29
The other students learn better	30
It makes sure the student gets back on task	39
It puts me back in control	40
It makes the student listen to me	45
It allows the lesson to continue	54
I do it because I am frustrated	61

Teachers who are more stressed because of classroom discipline use more of the following 6 coping responses

- Worry
- Wishful Thinking
- Keep to Self
- Tension Reduction (Vary Behaviour)
- Self Blame
- Get Sick

Get someone to "model" techniques that might work with this student	83
Have someone I trust listen to me talk about how I am feeling	83
Have someone watch me working with the student and offer advice on what else to do	64
